**Amendment to clauses 9 and 13 of Notice to submit a standard terms proposal for co-location on cellular mobile transmission sites**

Thank you for your e-mail dated 13 February 2008<sup>1</sup> regarding the date by which Vodafone New Zealand Limited ('Vodafone') is required to submit to the Commerce Commission ('Commission') a Standard Terms Proposal ('STP') for the Mobile Co-location Service.

The Commission notes that clauses 9 and 13 of the 'Notice to submit a standard terms proposal for co-location on cellular mobile transmission sites' issued on 8 February 2008 ('the Notice') require the STP to be submitted by 5.00pm, 25 April 2008.

The Commission acknowledges that 25 April 2008 is ANZAC day, and agrees that it is not appropriate for the STP to be submitted on a public holiday. The Commission approves your request to extend the due date for the STP to the following working day, which is Monday 28 April 2008.

Accordingly, this letter gives notice that clauses 9 and 13 of the Notice are revoked and replaced by:

"9. The Commission gives notice to Vodafone under section 30F of the Act to submit a standard terms proposal for the Mobile Co-location Service (**'the Proposal'**), to the Commission by **5.00pm, Monday, 28 April 2008.**"
